History

Victory in Europe Day/VE Day took place on May 8th 1945. It marked the end of World War 2 with Germany and bought to an end six years of suffering, courage and endurance across the world.

Imagine living in Britain and hearing the news that the war was over! People ran out on to the streets, hung bunting and banners and danced! The church bells rang and everyone bought out food to share at street parties. Fireworks filled the sky and people wore red, white and blue.

Can you write a postcard to a missing family member telling them about your VE Day celebrations? You could draw a picture on the other side to show what you did and what you saw!

On Youtube search 'Winston Churchill announcing Germany's unconditional surrender' to listen to the Prime Minister's broadcast to announce the war was over.

Jigsaw: Healthy Me

<u>Calm me:</u> Sit quietly and calmly. Can you hear the birds outside? Can you hear the whirring of the washing machine? What can you hear? Bring your attention to your breathing. Breathe in through your nose with long, gentle breaths and feel your lungs expand. Hold your breath for a couple of seconds and then gently and slowly release the air back out through your mouth.

The internet can reach huge numbers of people, meaning positive messages can reach people easily, TV and the internet can be enjoyable and help us to relax, we can stay in touch with people easily, socialising with friends is healthy, healthy recipes can be shared on Apps, we can watch a variety of sports which might encourage people to take up new activities, we can research how to be healthy.

• How can the media and social media **not help** people live a healthy lifestyle? Here are some of our ideas, can you think of any others?

We don't talk to each other in person, it can be easy to misunderstand messages on the internet which may make us worried or upset, videogames can keep us awake meaning we don't get enough sleep or exercise, adverts can encourage people to eat unhealthy foods, we might compare ourselves negatively to celebrities, many things on the internet are fake.

Let me learn:

You have been learning about healthy choices for your body and mind. Your task is to have a debate at home. A debate usually has a statement or question that needs to be discussed. Some people are 'for' the question, some are 'against.' The topic of the debate is, 'Does the media and social media help motivate people to live healthy and safe lifestyles?' Choose someone in your family to debate with – each person should present their case for two minutes.

Vocabulary to use: Therefore, furthermore, moreover, I strongly believe, consequently, as a result.

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


