Project of the week – Pirates!



Phonics



Sounds learned so far

Read these words by blending the sounds.

Group 1

mat, at, mad, sad, dad, sat, in, on, it, and, pin, got, dog, sit,

Group 2

Top, pan, gap, mud, bed, fan, fun, hen, ship, shop, fish, vet, mum.

Group 3

Sock, black, trap, blob, chat, quit, bang, sing, best, dress, fluff.

Read each word, by your child, saying each sound then saying the sounds more quickly to blend the word. Start with group 1 and when your child is more confident move up the groups.

Red Tricky words- the, I, no, go, was (these cannot be sounded out)

Next steps- Say a sentence using the different words and an adult could write these for you to read back.

E.g dad sat on the mat. **The** dress **was** in **the** shop and mum got mad.

Writing

Design your own treasure map.



Using your sounds label each part of your map and try write clues to help find the treasure. Use your phonics knowledge to write your sounds and words.

Which shapes have you used on your treasure map? Add the amount of footsteps needed between each item on your map.

Maths

Positional language, **above, under, behind, in front, next to, in between, on top.**

Draw a monkey on **top** of a tree.

Draw a troll **under** a bridge.

Draw some trees **next to** a cave.

Draw a boat **in between** some waves.

Extra daily ideas

Dress as a pirate (what can you find in your wardrobe?) and have a pirate tea party with your family or soft toys. Try writing an invitation. Key words needed- to, please, come, pirate, tea, party, time, love, from.

Make a pirate telescope.

What are you going to use and why? Could you show your adult how you made it?

Talk about your interesting idea, design your drink, write a list of ingredients.

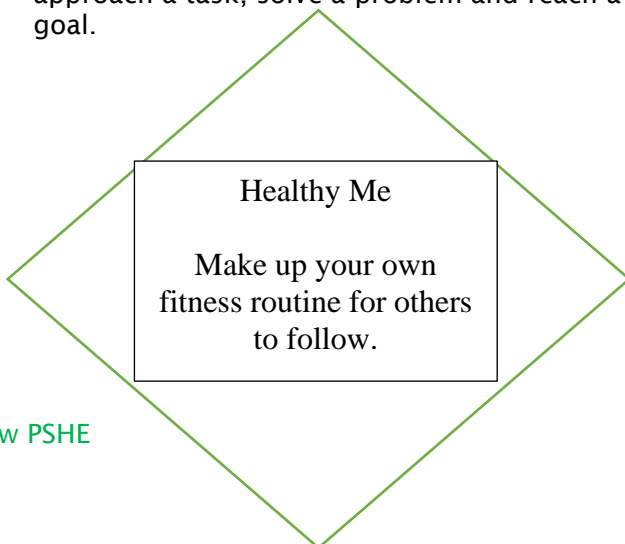
Bath time, fun time! – Sinking or floating
