One week project: Innovative, Interesting and Imaginative Inventions!

<u>Spelling</u>

Words are sometimes grouped into families because they have similarities in the way they are spelt and in their meaning. Look at the spellings below.

Temperature, temper, temperament, tempered, variety, vary, variation, varied, variable, variance.

- 1. Which words do you think are a family? What is similar about the way they are spelt?
- 2. Look up the meaning of these words. How are the words in the same family similar in meaning?
- 3. Extra challenge: write 5 words you can think of in the 'inter' family.

Grammar and Punctuation

This week we would like you to read **'Secret Garden'**. Try your best to complete the following:

- Word meaning questions (p. 4-7)
- Comprehension questions (p.14–15)
- Summarising question 3 (p.25)
- Inference questions (p.28 30)
- Predicting events questions (p.38)
- Whole text meaning question 1 (p.40)

Remember to use techniques like scanning, and the point-evidence structure to help you answer these questions. If you are struggling, please email your teacher with the question number that you are finding difficult. Next week, we will send out an answer sheet to self-mark, alongside an audio recording which will explain how you could find the answers for the trickier inference questions.

<u>Writing</u>

In English, we have been looking at explanation texts based on the book 'Until I met Dudley' which is aimed at teaching children how certain inventions work in a fun way. Look at this link to see some pages from the book:
