

Adverbs is a word that adds information about the verb. They give us more information about the verb.

An adverbial phrase is more than one word to describe a verb.

- Adverbials/adverbs answer one of four questions about the verb:
  - How a verb/action was done (manner)
    - E.g. Jessica shouted **cheerfully**.
  - When a verb/action was done (time)
    - E.g. Jessica shouted **at night** because she was scared.
  - Where a verb/action was done (place)
    - E.g. Jessica shouted **across the classroom**.
  - **How often** a verb/action was done (frequency)
    - E.g. Jessica shouted **all the time**.

# When? - Time

- E.g.
- Suddenly
- All of sudden
- On Tuesday
- Last week
- At 9:00pm
- This time
- As soon as we walked away
- Until the sun goes down

# Where? - Place

- E.g.
- In the distance
- Over there
- Under the hill
- In the bins
- On the roof
- Where they last saw us
- Around town
- By the birdbath

# How? - Manner

- E.g.
- Annoyingly
- Aggressively
- Simply
- Without care
- With a pencil
- In a very rude manner
- Completely
- As though his life depended on it
- With much consideration

# How often? - Frequency

- E.g.
- Once
- Twice
- Every Monday
- Often
- Always
- All the time
- Rarely
- Immediately
- Occasionally
- Frequently
