



Sports Funding 2017-18

Since September 2013 the Government has allocated funding directly to primary schools to support the provision of quality PE/Sport. The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and Sport, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. With an expected increase in funding this year, each school will receive £16,000 plus an extra £10 per pupil each year – here at Laurance Haines that will mean around £20,000 per year. It is important that we use the money wisely. In order to get the best value and maximum impact for our children, we plan to use the money to:

1. Engage ALL pupils in regular physical activity
2. Continue to build the profile of PE and Sport at Laurance Haines
3. Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in the teaching of PE and Sport
4. Offer a broader experience and a range of sports and activities to pupils
5. Increase participation in competitive sport

These areas will be targeted through the allocation of the Sports Premium Fund. Below is an overview of the intended spending:

- **School Sports Partnership Contract**

The Schools Sports Partnership, based at Queens' School, will support Laurance Haines to deliver a specialist PE and Sport service. The partnership will provide strategic planning, monitoring and evaluation of programmes designed to enhance the provision of PE and school sport. A PE specialist will support the staff and sports apprentice (details below), through regular visits, to implement intra-school competitions, arrange competitions, tournaments and festivals with other schools in the partnership and to engage the less active pupils across the school to take part in regular physical activity.

- **Sporting Futures Apprentice**

In partnership with Sporting Futures, with recognition from the National Apprenticeship Service, a PE and School Sports Apprentice will work with Laurance Haines to aid our teaching team with the delivery of PE lessons, engage the less active pupils through lunch time and after school activities and support with the preparation and delivery of intra and inter school competition. Together with the Sporting Futures team, the apprentice will be supported to work through a high quality sporting programme.

- **Specialist Coaches for extra-curricular activity and sport**

Specialist coaches from a range of recognised sporting organisations will support the school to offer a broader experience and a range of sports and activities to pupils during lunchtime and after school clubs. This, in turn, will enhance our overall provision of PE and Sport across the school.

- **Resources and Equipment**

Some of the funding will also be used to replace and update the existing sports equipment. As ever, purchasing of a wider range of sports equipment to be used across the key stages and throughout the school day will enhance our overall provision of PE and Sport across the school.



Measuring Impact

The school will again be working towards the School Games Gold Mark, which is a government led awards scheme launched in 2012 to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community. This will provide regular monitoring opportunities and will provide a clear level of impact. Further impact will be measured through:

- An increase in pupil participation in sport
- An increase in participation in competition
- Lesson observations (of teaching teams and visiting coaches) to demonstrate a good provision of PE and Sport
