## **WELCOME**

A very warm welcome to you all for the beginning of the new school year. Although for many the summer holidays will seem like a distant memory, we hope that you were all able to spend time with families and friends and that the children were able to return to school with much excitement. We trust your children are settling into their new teams, getting know new friends and new teachers. We hope too that our parents feel well-supported in these opening weeks and that our teaching team has started to build links with you.

The term for our staff began with two INSET training days. The first was spent with colleagues across the Inclusive MAT with the training centred around collaboration and celebrating diversity, with Diverse Educators. Teams enjoyed productive conversations and planning to ensure the steps we take as individuals, schools and as one trust, are truly inclusive and lead to a sense of belonging for children, parents, staff and the community. Our second day was spent with the Laurance Haines team, with sessions focused on the implementation of the curriculum that has been designed to be more representative of our wider community and workshops for support staff to facilitate academic progress across the core subjects. Your children will be feeling the benefit of the training over the weeks and months to come.

Following a week of team building activities to support the children to form the relationships necessary for successful learning this year, the children have returned to full curriculum lessons this week. Historical learning has been central to the experience where children have been learning about their personal past, the history of Watford, the Tudors and Romans and the industrial revolution. Please do check in with the children to find out what they have remembered of their learning, just as teachers will be doing in the coming weeks. Next week's focus subject is geography!

Since the passing of Queen Elizabeth II, the children have been reflecting on the life of this great monarch and have been commemorating her in various different ways. The teachers have worked with children to provide a space for mourning and celebration. In singing assemblies, the children have been learning our new national anthem, 'God Save the King'. School will be closed on Monday 19th September for the state funeral. Beyond then, the children will be exposed to learning around historical elements of the Royal Family, including some aspects of colonialism and imperialism. These lessons will of course be carried out in a sensitive, respectful and age-appropriate manner.

On Wednesday 28th September, we invite you all to join us for Open Evening. You will all have the opportunity to meet with current and previous teachers and teaching teams. Communal areas of the school will be open again to you so there will be plenty of opportunity to speak with staff across the school and find out the different sorts of things that children have been learning about. We hope to see as many of you there as possible.

#### SPOTLIGHT ON LEARNING

This week we have been busy launching our Laurance Haines Curriculum! This week our whole school community have been exploring the question "Who are we?" If you have any time this weekend, please take a look at Twitter and explore all the incredible learning experiences the children have had this week. History has been the subject of the week with children from Year One to Year Six understanding how events unfold in time order with our older children investigating what 'chronological' means. They have also been understanding how we find out about events that happening the past by using 'historical sources'.

In the Early Years, the children have been discovering what is unique about them and sharing that with each other. The children in Year One have been putting their day's activities on a timeline and learning Makaton for 'past', 'before' and 'now'. Ask any child in Year Two about what has happened to the Watford football club over last 100 years and they will be happy to reel off many facts including that they used to play motorbike football on the pitch!

In Year Three, the children have been learning about some key history of Watford and specifically about the changes to Cassiobury over time. In Year Four, the children have learnt what Roman life was like including what the fashion was like and what hairstyles they had.

In Year Five, the children have been immersed in a Tudor world and even had a visit from Queen Elizabeth I! The children in Year 6 have been discovering how important the Grand Union Canal has been for Watford and industry has thrived because of the ease transporting goods on narrowboats. This is just a snapshot - it's been an absolutely incredible week of learning!
