Year 4 were linking art and writing together – exploring illustrations in narratives and using mixed media to convey tone using hues and depth in those illustrations. Wonderful stuff! In music the children have been learning about gospel music through the song, This Little Light of Mine. The pentatonic scale, gospel music, off-beat, rhythm and call-and-response are all music skills they have been learning. Look out for this song too in our Harvest Festival next week.

Year 5 had to think outside the box for their artwork which combined 2D to 3D ideas and textiles. Rather than using expensive individual mannequins, the children created their own from newspaper and foil – genius! And how incredibly well dressed they were – well done Year 5! In music, they have been learning the difference between the two styles of music, where the music originated from and why. How, instruments, structure, texture, vocal decoration, phasing and articulating, harmony, solos are used and all about the music director, Kirk Franklin.

Over in Year 6, the children also created 3D sculptures from a 2D drawings, capturing the inspiration they took from Lubaina Himid and creating enlarged human figures which represented themselves. In Music, they've been creating a fabulous sound with Hey Mr Miller. Syncopation, swing rhythm, listening to big band instruments and scat singing are just a few of the skills they have learnt this week. Well done everyone! It has been wonderful to see your beautiful artwork and hear snippets of songs being sung around the school – even by teachers in the playground! We are both so proud of you all for bringing out your inner artist and musician!

SPOTLIGHT ON LEARNING

The last two weeks have been a hive of artistic excitement across the classrooms at Laurance Haines. Both Mrs Makinson and Mrs Goss have been in their element, seeing and hearing all the creativity going on in our Art week and then Music week!

Down in KS1, they focused on Spirals in Year 1 for art. They looked at different circular shapes and even creatures like snails! Year 2 created beautiful Autumnal wax resist pictures with crayons, pastels and water colours. In music, the children have been learning off beat rhythms, rest, marching on the beat, call and respond, echo singing and pitch through the Menu Song – look out for this in our Harvest Festival next week. A wonderful performance that might leave you feeling hungry!

Year 2 have been learning how to use instruments, rhythm, articulation, tempo, and pitch to create pictures of the animals in our imaginations all inspired by Saint-Saens, Carnival of the Animals. They have watched performances by the Kennah-Mason family and learnt how music can be used to create different, exciting sounds!

In Year 3, they worked with charcoal and learnt about the art of Chiaroscuro – using light and dark in artwork. They smudged, erased and even used their fingers to create their work. In Music, they have been learning beat, tempo and the time signatures 3/4 and 4/4 through folk songs that come from all around the world. They have used tuned and untuned instruments to add timbre and the sounds floating up have been almost angelic!


