WELCOME

As part of our 50th Birthday Celebrations, the children have taken part in a range of activities in a week of learning around the creative arts. Children have been designing birthday cakes, commemorative school uniforms and even writing and performing raps about life at Laurance Haines across the 50 years. Do check in with Twitter to see a range of these learning experiences.

Feeling Good Week is a Hertfordshire-wide event that encourages schools and the wider community to promote children and young people's emotional wellbeing by raising awareness of mental health and showing where support can be accessed within the community. Across the school this week, children and staff have been exploring the themes of being kind and connecting. Children have explored the protective behaviours, which are ways to stay safe inside and outside of school, and our 6 Principles of Nurture. Online safety has also been a focus this week so please check in with your children about tips they may be able to share with you too. We were again joined by the incredible team from Electric Umbrella who put on an incredible show for our KS2 children yesterday.

At the midway point in the year, children across the school have taken part in assessments across the core subjects. Whilst the teachers are constantly assessing their academic, social and emotional needs, these assessments are intended to provide rich information to guide the teaching and learning over the coming term. To assess the children's progress with writing, the teaching teams worked with colleagues across the Inclusive MAT to moderate the assessment, ensuring that judgements are accurate and consistent. This sort of activity is one of the many benefits of working in a trust with a group of schools.

After half term, we invite you to join us for parent consultation meetings, where you will be able to speak with teachers to find out about your child's experience and progress in school. We invite you to book sessions with the teachers via Arbor, following the instructions sent out in the letter you will have received. Should you have any questions ahead of the consultations or need any support with access to them, please speak with a member of the school team and we'd be happy to help.

The school's relationship with the wider community is absolutely key. Unfortunately, there have been a small number of parents parking illegally at the beginning and end of the day on Rose Gardens. I ask you all to take notice of the parking restrictions and be respectful to our close neighbours - the residents or Rose Gardens. Thank you in advance.

Wishing you all a wonderful half term break. We look forward to welcoming the children back to school on Tuesday 21st February.

Feeling Good Week

As part of children's mental health week, we have been taking part in Hertfordshire's Feeling Good Week with the theme 'be kind and connect'. Have you spotted the new markings on the KS1 playground? We were fortunate to be awarded £500 and this was spent on a positive sayings hopscotch and mirror me game to encourage the children in their play with each other. They have been a huge success! All the children from across the school have been out playing the new games, connecting with each other and having fun. Please take a look at our twitter pages.

The children have been learning about the positive affect of being kind on their mental health and this has included staying safe online during safer internet day on Tuesday. Their online presence is part of how they communicate and socialise, so learning about friendships and being kind online is so important for their mental health. Please talk to your child about how to use their technology safely and to talk to you about any worries they may have when communicating online.

There has been so much going on across the week, such as sharing a house breakfast with children from across the years, so widening friendships and connecting children outside of their Team who they would not usually spend time with, debating questions such as which is better being kind or being happy. We were so excited to welcome back Electric Umbrella as well and have a fabulous sing-a-long which could be heard all over school! Staff have also been connecting and spending time together at a quiz night and with a staff room full of cake! The children made all our new staff who revealed a fun fact about themselves welcome to our Laurance Haines family in celebration assembly today, another example of connecting with others.

Finally to recognise all the work the children have been doing in 'being kind and connecting' they have all received our red connect badge to wear with pride as part of our five ways to wellbeing and Feeling Good Week!


ATTENDANCE
