Firstly, I would like to say a huge thank you to the entire community for your support, love and encouragement over the last couple of weeks. This morning, I was able to share the news in assembly and the children cheered with joy. It was an incredible moment.

We will be deeply sad to see Mr Gray go to another school at the end of the year but I pledge to continue the amazing magic he has been able to create here at Laurance Haines.

Our ECO work is incredibly important to us. Our Year 6 children have been working on the Green Schools Project. This has involved exploring climate change, what the main contributors are and also the huge impact it has had on the planet. They have also investigated in detail, carbon emissions from purchasing, usage of energy, food and travel. They have also been working out what the carbon footprint these things leave and the impact that they have. Maths skills have been utilised by calculating the schools own carbon footprint and the children have been able to identify areas we can improve further. Once our main areas have been identified, the Year 6 teams will lead us to make changes in order to improve our own carbon footprint.

We have already come such a long way with our sustainability work but we know there is still so much more we can do.
