## MILK FOR AUTUMN TERM 2023

For parents with children currently in Nursery, Reception and Years 1 - 5 - the cost of milk for the Autumn Term is £26.64.

Nursery children moving up to Reception class – If your child was born after 20th December 2018 then they are entitled to free school milk. If your child is 5 before 20th December 2023, then you will need to pay if you wish for them to have milk.\*

Current Reception, and children in Years 1 - 5 – If you would like your child to have milk then you will need to pay.\*


\* Milk is also free for children who receive income related free school meals. Please note that the introduction of free meals for all KS1 children does not include free milk.

To order milk payment must be made through Arbor by Tuesday 18th July 2023. The payment is available under “trips”. Please do not pay in to your child's meal account. Thank you.


