WHAT OUR DAY LOOKS LIKE

CALM START

Our school day begins in class with a calm start, a time for children to do their emotion boards and engage in therapeutic activities such as mindfulness, yoga, reading for pleasure or to just have a quiet chat with their peers. It prepares the children and gets them in the right frame of mind for the active learning day ahead. Toast stations are situated in every classroom and can be accessed freely.





CORE SUBJECTS

Each day children will engage in handwriting and spelling sessions, reading, English and mathematics. In addition to this PE, Jigsaw, Computing and Spanish is taught weekly.

DAILY MILE

Children challenge themselves daily with their class peers to run a mile. It is not only daily exercise, it releases endorphins and builds resilience and selfesteem.





CHILD-LED CURRICULUM

We teach a wide and varied curriculum on a weekly basis, allowing children to become fully immersed in the skills and knowledge of each of the foundation subjects. Our teaching and learning is driven by the statement, 'You see me, You hear me, I belong' and we utilise pupil voice to shape our learning experiences.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What does my child need to bring every day?

Their reading book, link book, pencil case, water bottle, PE kit and coat.

How do I communicate with the class teacher?

Via the link book, email, parent consultations or organising a meeting at the classroom door.

What time does school start and finish?

8.50 am (doors open at 8:45am) – 3.20 pm.

What if my child is hungry in the morning?

Every morning, toast is available in the classroom. Please also send your child in with a healthy snack for their break time.

Is there any homework in KS2?

Every week, the children will be given a Preview Home Learning sheet. This will include creative activities, research suggestions and tasks to give them a 'head start' for their upcoming learning.

Medicines

Any medication needs to be given to the school office with a complete and up-to-date medical form. Please ensure medication is kept in date.

How often should my child be reading?

Ideally every day but definitely at least three times a week. Please sign the link book to acknowledge that your child had read.

When does my child do PE?

In Year 3, PE takes place on a Friday. In Year 4, PE is on a Monday (and will be either PE or gymnastics). However, we encourage you to send your child in on Monday with their PE kit and take it home on Friday for a wash.
