WHAT OUR DAY LOOKS LIKE

CALM START

Our school day begins in class with a calm start, a time for children to check in with their emotions and engage in therapeutic activities, team or individual learning experiences, reading for pleasure or to just have a quiet chat with their peers. It prepares the children and gets them in the right frame of mind for the active learning day ahead. Toast stations are situated in every classroom and can be accessed freely by the children.



CORE SUBJECTS

Each day children will engage in spelling sessions, reading, English and mathematics lessons. In addition to this, PE, Jigsaw, Computing and Spanish is taught weekly.



DAILY MILE

Children challenge themselves daily with their class peers to run a mile. It is not only daily exercise, it releases endorphins and builds resilience and self-esteem.



CHILD-LED CURRICULUM

Our topics are linked to our school values and are question driven, linked to the children's interests. Our curriculum covers a wide range of subjects, such as Science, Design and Technology, Arts and Humanities and builds upon the Early Years Foundation Stage.



WELCOME

Our aim is that during their time at Laurance Haines, your children fulfil their academic and social potential. In doing this, they can reap the rewards and benefits of being caring, confident, enquiring and independent individuals, able to take their place as active citizens in a multi-cultural society.

Our staff plan the curriculum with emphasis on the children's interests, to ensure the children make good progress towards their goals.

Pupils experience a range of activities, indoors, outdoors and off-site, to develop skills, knowledge and independence. They learn actively within a strong routine. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What does my child need to bring every day?

Reading book, link book, water bottle and coat. PE kits should remain in school all week.

How do I communicate with the class teacher?

Via the link book, email, parent consultations or organising a meeting at the classroom door.

What time does school start and finish?

8.50 am (doors open at 8:45am)– 3.20 pm.

What if my child is hungry in the morning?

Every morning, toast is available in the classroom. You are also welcome to send your child in with a healthy snack for their break time, however one is also offered to your child each day.

Is there any homework in KS1?

Every week, the children will be given a Preview Home Learning sheet. This will include creative activities, research suggestions and tasks to give them a 'head start' for the upcoming learning.

Medicines

Any medication needs to be given to the school office with a complete and up-to-date medical form. Please ensure medication is kept in-date.

How often should my child be reading?

Ideally every day for five to ten minutes but definitely at least three times a week. Please sign the link book and write a short comment to acknowledge that your child had read.

When does my child do PE?

In Year 1, PE takes place on a Thursday. In Year 2, PE is on a Monday. However, we encourage you to send your child in on Monday with their PE kit and take it home on Friday for a wash.h.

KS1 SATS - YEAR 2

The KS1 SAT's are sat during the month of May. They are delivered in small, supported groups and are referred to as 'special work'. The Year 2 children will complete 4 papers; 2 in maths (arithmetic and reasoning) and 2 in Reading.
