





Multi award-winning online reading programme for ages 2–13. Children follow the guided, one-on-one lessons that match their ability.




Audible

Children can instantly stream an incredible collection of stories, including titles across eight different languages from audible. All stories are free to stream on desktops, laptops, phones or tablets.

Explore the collection, select a title and start listening.

If you go to 'Elementary' or 'Tween', they are suitable for Primary aged children as appropriate.
