ARBOR

Please do ensure that you are regularly checking your child's Arbor account. We share important information on there, such as school trips, clubs and parent evening booking slots.

If your child is in Key Stage 2 and has school meals, you must ensure that there are adequate funds in their Arbor account to pay for them. The price of a school meal is £2.45. From 1st October 2023, it is not an option to accumulate debt for school meals. If funds are not available in your child's Arbor account you will be required to supply a healthy packed lunch each day.
