### SPOTLIGHT ON LEARNING

What incredible experiences and learning the children have had during Anti-Bullying Week's 'make some noise'. It has been an invaluable opportunity for all children to learn about the negative impacts of bullying and understand the importance of promoting kindness and respect. The week began with "Odd Socks Day," a fantastic event that celebrated individuality and diversity. By wearing odd socks, our school community showed solidarity and acceptance towards one another. It was a delight to see the children embracing their unique qualities and appreciating the differences amongst their friends.

During the week, the children engaged in various activities that helped them distinguish between banter and bullying. We wanted them to understand the fine line between friendly teasing and hurtful behaviour. Through interactive class discussions and workshops, the children gained a deeper understanding of the emotions that bullying can evoke and learnt how their words and actions impact on others. Furthermore, we focused on educating the children about online bullying, a prevalent issue in today's digital age. They participated in informative sessions that highlighted the consequences of cyberbullying and provided strategies to stay safe online. Our aim was to equip our students with the knowledge to protect themselves and others from online harm. Additionally, we were fortunate to have a visit from Emily, from the Mental Health Support Team who spoke to parents and then Year 5 and 6 children about the impact of social media on their mental wellbeing. They provided guidance on how to navigate social media platforms responsibly and how to seek help if they encounter negative experiences online. We truly believe that fostering a healthy relationship with social media is crucial for our the children's overall well-being. Year 3 spent a morning at Watford FC, learning about being an upstander not a bystander and speaking out about bullying. A wonderful learning experience with a treat of a tour of the stadium included!

Throughout Anti-Bullying Week, we emphasised the importance of kindness and the role it plays in creating a positive school environment. It was heartwarming to witness their enthusiasm and dedication towards spreading positivity and supporting their peers. We commend the children for their participation and engagement during Anti-Bullying Week. It was inspiring to witness their commitment towards promoting inclusivity and compassion within our school community. We believe that their understanding of bullying will continue to grow, setting a foundation for a safe and respectful school environment.
