SPOTLIGHT ON LEARNING

Hertfordshire Feeling Good Week

This is an event we have celebrated for many years to support the children's understanding of their mental health and how to look after their own wellbeing. This year's theme is 'Kindness in Nature' and we were fortunate to be successful in applying for a £500 grant.

In researching and hearing the children's opinions we decided to focus the learning on the impact that birds have on our wellbeing. We discovered that birdsong can reduce stress, focus attention, improve listening skills and help calmness. To encourage more birds into school there will be birdboxes, bird tables and bird feeders located around the outside area.

We are also very excited to have a wi-fi enabled bird box to see birds nesting and view this in classes! In addition, the children have been making bird cakes to feed the birds and ensure we have more birds visiting the playground to hear the birdsong that will improve our mood and wellbeing. It would be wonderful if you can support your child's learning by looking out for birds you see out and about or in your gardens and listening to the birds singing, drawing your child's attention to really listen.
