

MILK FOR SUMMER TERM

The cost of milk for the Spring Term is £24.32.

Please note that the introduction of free school meals to all KS1 children does not include free milk. The following arrangements apply:

Milk is free for all children in Nursery, and those in Reception who were born after 1st April 2019.

Milk is also free for children in KS2 who receive free school meals.

For all other children you will need to pay if you wish for them to have milk.

Payment must be made online via Arbor by Monday 25th March 2024, BUT IMPORTANT PLEASE NOTE that on Arbor you will now need to:

- 1) Go to "School Shop"
- 2) Select "School Shop Products"
- 3) Select "Milk for Summer 2024"
- 4) Click on the quantity and select "1"
- 5) Select "Buy Product"
- 6) Select "Pay Now" and then make payment.
